Important Pupil Premium notice

Did you know that your child could be helping to bring extra funding into school?

If your family receives certain benefits, your child may be eligible for Pupil Premium. This funding helps us provide additional support, resources and enrichment opportunities that benefit children throughout their time at school. It also means that core funding can be used for some of those items which school otherwise, struggles to afford, such as air conditioning.

Even if your child does not have school meals, or you are unsure whether you qualify, we encourage you to check, as the school and your child will still benefit. The application is quick, confidential and could make a real difference to your child's education.

If you think you may be eligible, or would like help completing an application, please contact the school office. We're always happy to help.

Thank you for taking a few moments to check your eligibility and for your continued support.

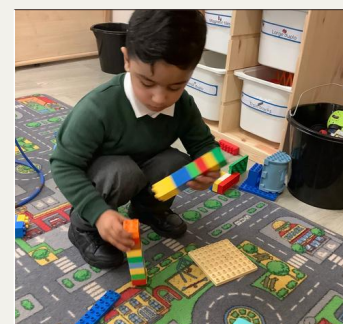


Nursery's Wonderful Willow Adventure Begins!

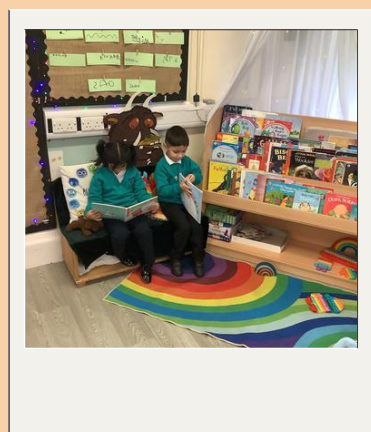
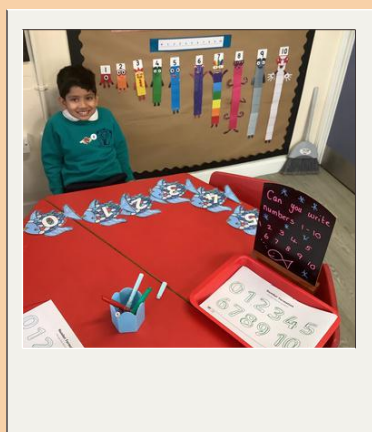
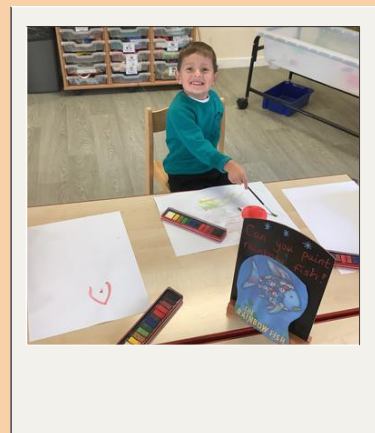
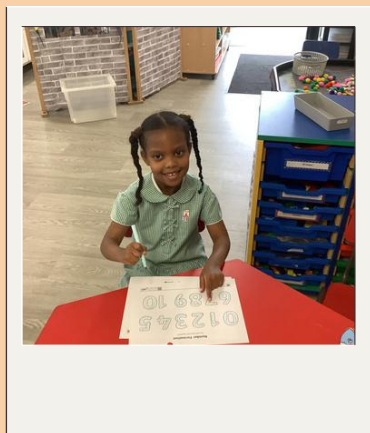
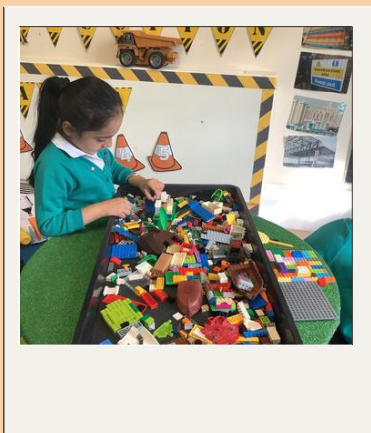
Reception Are Right at Home at Willow!

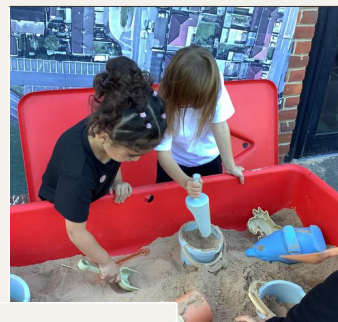
🌿 Year 1's Outdoor Learning Adventure! 🌳 ✨

These practical experiences are helping our young mathematicians build a strong understanding of number while developing their confidence and curiosity.

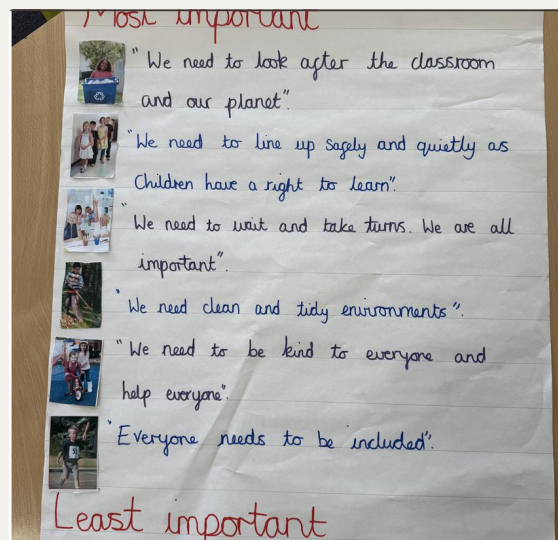
Year 2 Learn How We All Belong!

We were so proud to see our Year 2 children showing the kindness, respect and teamwork that make Willow such a special community. What thoughtful little citizens we have!   



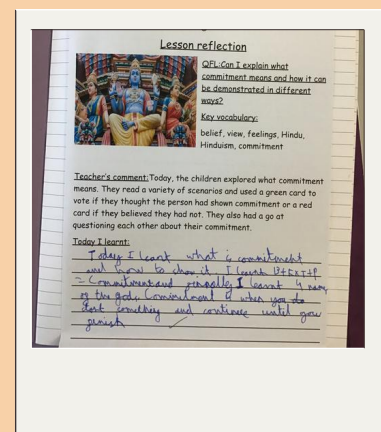
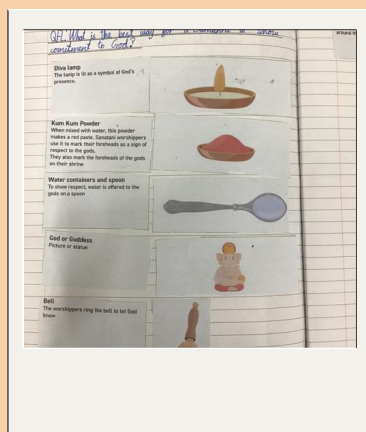
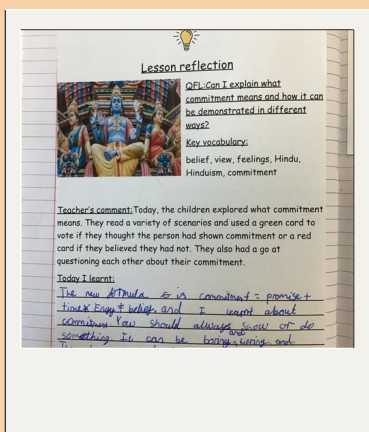
🪔 Year 5's Journey into Sanatana Dharma! ✨

There have been some wonderfully thoughtful conversations taking place in Year 5 as the children explore their RE Big Question: What is the best way for a Sanatani to show commitment to God?

To begin their learning, the children thought about what commitment looks like in everyday life. They shared examples of things they are committed to themselves and considered the time, effort and perseverance that commitment can require. They even discovered a special formula – $C = P + T \times E + B$ – which helped them think more deeply about how commitment can be shown in different ways.

Their learning then took them into the world of Sanatana Dharma. Year 5 discovered that Sanatanis believe in one Supreme God, Brahman, and began exploring some of the ways people show their love and devotion to God. The children learnt about puja, explored the important features of a shrine and considered why these objects and practices are meaningful to Sanatanis.

Our Year 5 classrooms have been full of curious questions, thoughtful reflections and respectful discussions as the children share their ideas and listen to one another. We love seeing our Willow pupils approach learning about different faiths and beliefs with such interest, maturity and respect. There is still plenty more to discover as Year 5 continue exploring their Big Question! 🪔 ✨ 💙

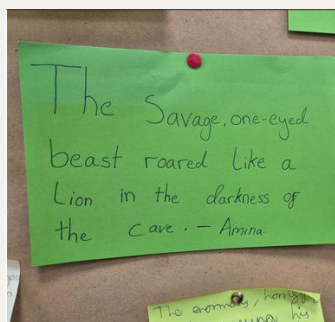
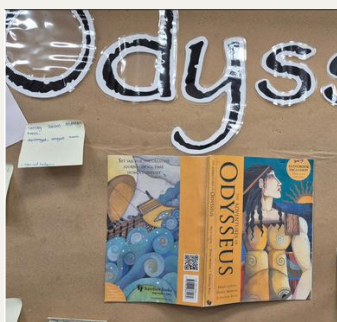


⚔️ Year 6 Set Sail with Odysseus! 🏺

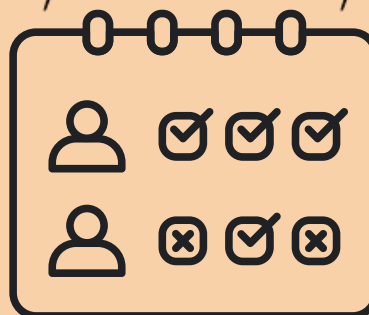

If you would like your child to attend Breakfast club or Meerkats you will need to apply for a space. For more information or an application form, enquire at the school office.

Please note, there is a different payment schedule for Pupil Premium/ Free School Meal pupils. Please contact the office before applying.

All pupils must be booked in advance otherwise they will not be allowed to attend. If your child attends Meerkats without a booking you will be charged the late fee. Children must not attend Breakfast Club without a booking as numbers are limited. Please book a week in advance.

You are required to sign your child in to Breakfast Club and out of Meerkats each day.

We kindly request that no dogs (or any other pets) are brought onto the school premises, even if they are being carried.

Please also ensure that bikes and scooters are not ridden anywhere within the school grounds. There have been a few concerns raised about near accidents involving pedestrians. When leaving bikes in the designated bike area, please make sure they are securely locked.

Additionally, we ask all parents and carers to be considerate of our neighbours during drop-off and pick-up times. Please park responsibly and drive calmly and safely around the school.

Willow School Uniform

Our Willow school uniform is:

- Green Sweatshirt or cardigan
- Navy blue trousers, shorts or skirt
- White shirt or polo shirt
- Black sensible shoes (no boots, high heels or platforms)
- (Nursery – the above with dark coloured jogging bottoms)
- PE Kit – plain white T-Shirt (round neck or polo), navy/black shorts.
- A dark tracksuit (plain or with a small logo) to wear over the PE Kit for outdoor lessons in cold weather. Trainers/plimsolls are needed for all PE lessons.



All items of clothing must be clearly labelled with the child's name.

The only jewellery allowed is one small stud in each ear, a watch and that which is a specific religious requirement. These must all be removed for PE. The child must take full responsibility for looking after these items. the school will accept no responsibility for their loss or damage.

PE and Games – PE is not an optional subject, it is a part of the national curriculum.

Swimming in KS2 – Swimming is not an optional subject. A letter with swimming costume requirements will be sent when your child is in year 4.

Parent Notices

A REMINDER ABOUT SAFE AND RESPECTFUL PICK-UP AND DROP-OFF

We would like to remind all families about the importance of safe, sensible and respectful behaviour during pick-up and drop-off times.

For everyone's safety, please ensure that:

- Pavements are kept clear and not used for parking, so that children, pushchairs and families who cannot step into the road can pass safely.

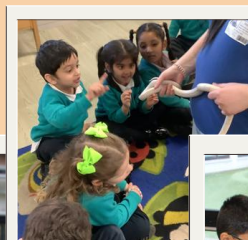
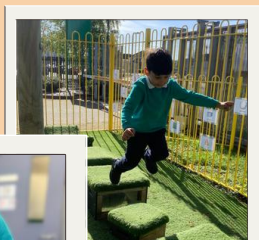

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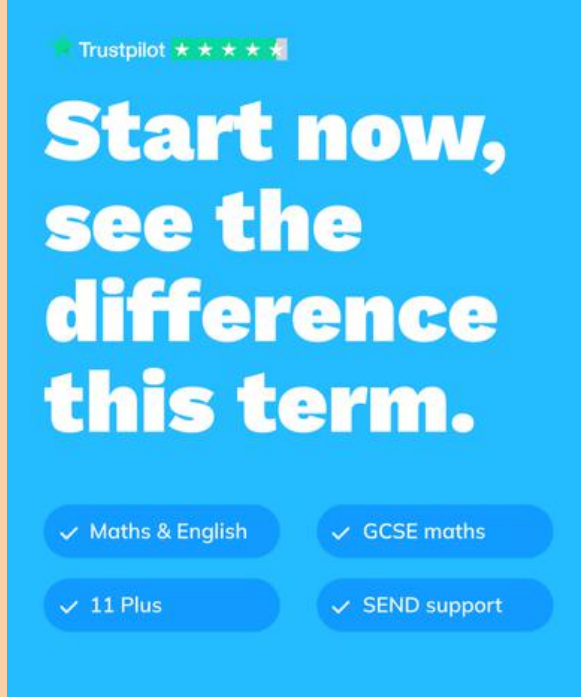
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
